THE GRAMMY: REALIZING POTENTIAL

Michelle Avalos has been selected as The Grammy recipient this month for her commitment to supporting changemakers (especially first gen individuals) in realizing their potential. As cofounder of Impact Hub Houston, Tech23, and Creative Vida; Michelle is committed to empowering diverse changemakers, first generation college students, Latinos in Tech, entrepreneurs, and innovators to create inclusive and equitable spaces and build an ecosystem where people work together across industries, cultures, identities, geographies, and generations in the city of Houston. In addition to her nonprofit ventures, Michelle serves on the advisory committee for Baker Ripley Pasadena Campus, business trainer at the West Houston Institute, and ambassador at Hispanic star – committed to further expanding her capacity to support others as they realize their potential.

In the Fall of 2021 Michelle bridge a collaboration between Impact Hub Houston and Baker Ripley to create the Young Leaders Academy to pilot a program "designed for youth ages 18-24 from the City of South Houston, Pasadena, Deer Park, Galena Park, and La Porte who were recent high school graduates (or had a GED) and were exploring college or their first career path."



This year, Impact Hub Houston hosted a Hispanic Business Summit - a collaborative event hosted during Latino Entrepreneurs Week focused around the "impact of Latino entrepreneurship in Houston, small business success stories, and a panel of lenders for tips on accessing business capital" along with the U.S. Small Business Administration, Houston Christian University (HCU), and Baker Ripley. In recognition of the richness of Hispanic culture, and in full commitment to empowering Hispanic voices; the Hispanic Business Summit was hosted entirely in Spanish - recognizing origin roots of the Hispanic community and historical disrupting the anecdote of assimilation.
