THE GRAMMY: TRANSFORMATIVE **CLASSROOM PRACTICES**


This month we are honored to award Jade as our recipient of The Grammy for transformative classroom practices. We first learned about Jade by coming across a video of her patiently helping two students resolve conflict while in class, empowering these students to practice healthy emotional regulation and confidently navigate health coping. We admire Jade for her transformative classroom approach that turns away from exclusionary practices that are harmful to youth development, criminalize behavior, and lead to future deviance and alienation.

Jade shared with us that her fifth grade teacher sparked her passion for teaching. Jade shared memories of feeling like, "we never did any 'schoolwork' because we were always having so much fun! I believe school should be an enjoyable experience for all students."

Faced with the daily responsibilities and challenges of teaching; Jade shared candidly, "I care so much about my kids. My brain is always turning, thinking of ways I can engage my students and plan ahead for lessons this took a toll on me at first".

Committed to empowering her students, Jade shared that to overcome challenges she started to prioritize things on her to-do list and get serious about practice self-care; for example, by protecting spending quality time with her fiancé, "so that the never-ending list didn't seem so overwhelming - in order to pour into my students, I take time to refill my own bucket."





Jade hopes to inspire others to consider how compassion and patience teaches youth to be resilient and prepares them to overcome future challenges confidence. To quote, "I hope they remember all the silly laughs we shared and also the tears that we worked hard to get through together".

In closing, Jade shared a quote from Nelson Mandela that says, "Do not judge me by my success, judge me by how many times I fell down and got back up again." Stating that to her, "resilience is what you will do to help yourself get back up after falling down".



COMMUNITY NEWS:

On December 11th, Spring Branch ISD trustees voted 6:1 to close five campuses that service a student population that's "over 90 percent Hispanic and 80 percent economically disadvantaged" (Dunlap M., 2023). Community members raised concerns about these closures favoring more affluent neighborhoods in the area while disproportionately impacting underserved families; noting, decision makers are not representative of the community or their needs.

These closures are expected to negatively impact more than 2,000 students who will be displaced to surrounding schools.
